

LOW VOLUME ROAD OVERLAYS

DESCRIPTION

This year, three County roads are included in the annual maintenance overlay program for lower volume roads. Drainage pipes, reclamation, pavement milling, hot mix asphalt paving, shoulders and traffic barrier are typical work items addressed with the project. Drainage pipe work will be completed under a separate contract. Maintaining our roads with a strong overlay program delays or eliminates the need for much more costly road reconstruction.

Once construction begins, traffic will be maintained through the work zone with flagging operations. Construction is expected to last about three months. Weekly press releases will identify the roadwork planned for the following week. The press releases will appear in the local newspaper and on the County's website.

Public Works thanks the public for their patience and understanding as this roadwork proceeds.

UPDATES

October 12, 2011:

The construction work (pipe culverts, paving, and ancillary shoulder work) for the three roads is complete.

June 16, 2011:

Pipe culvert construction is underway on Feeser Road North and Humbert Schoolhouse Road.

April 25, 2011:

The four bids opened on April 6, 2011 for the paving work were reviewed and presented to the Board of Commissioners. The Board approved the paving project on April 21, 2011. Contract award is underway.

January 14, 2011:

Collection of field data is near completion. The data is being tabulated and included in the bid document that will be advertised for construction.

The paving project is scheduled for advertisement in February 2011.
